Swiss Galloway Association (Helen Keller) advised the conference that there are 200 Galloway herds in Switzerland and the Association registers all colours in the one herdbook. Of the 30,000+ cattle of all breeds in Switzerland, 1,500 + are Galloways. All Galloway beef is sold via direct marketing. Highlands are the biggest extensive breed as they are seen as being organic. Galloways will go the hills in the summer for approx. 100 days, then they stay the rest of the year near the farm. Recently there has been problems with walkers in the hills with the continental breeders. Galloways have had no such problems.

2016 World Galloway Conference will be hosted by the Galloway Cattle Society of Great Britain & Northern Ireland in August 2016. Scott McKinnon, on behalf of the Galloway Cattle Society & Liz Wilkinson, on behalf of the Belted Galloway Society, advised that the Conference would

commence on Friday 5th August 2016 and the Headquarters for the Conference will be in Gretna Green.

Invitations were received from The Australian Belted Galloway Association & the Belted Galloway Society, Inc of USA to host the 2018 or 2020. On a show of hands (25 Australia / 10 USA) it was declared that the 2018 World Galloway Conference would be hosted by the Australian Belted Galloway Association and the 2020 World Galloway Conference would be hosted by the Belted Galloway Society, Inc of USA.

Appointment of Office Bearers

General Business

- 1. Cattle Market Streams** – Anne Menrath, German Beef Cattle Breeders Federation presented a talk on International Beef Trade. She advised that in the last 50 years meat production had doubled. Poultry had increased the most, followed by pigs. Beef and Lamb had not increased
- 2. Galloway Brochure** - Georg Menke advised the meeting that at the 2012 Conference Barry McAlley had asked "Why have Galloways lost their place in the Beef Industry?"
Georg's thoughts on this are that the BSE crisis damaged the image of Galloways in Germany and many other countries. He felt that we need to produce a high quality beef and as the numbers of Galloways was small, Self-Marketing was the Key to Success. With

this in mind a Brochure "Galloway – The Genuine Alternative" was produced and was presented to the Conference.

3. Nutritional Quality – FSA - Greg Stuart spoke on this subject.

From data published in the Journal of Animal Science 2006 – it confirms that German Galloways marbled more than the other breeds tested and the Galloway Feed Efficiency was also highest.

From data published in the Journal of Animal Science 1996 – it confirms that Galloway beef is the most flavoursome and juicy of those tested – this can assist the marketing of Galloway beef.

FSA has published data on meat nutritional factors. MSA has assessed the nutritional quality against FSA published data for the same cuts of beef. MSA has assessed eating quality according to the FSA data.

Research carried out in USA, Canada, Denmark, Germany and other countries over many years all support what Galloway breeders have said for many years regarding the quality of Galloway beef.
